Hello from Baltimore!

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation is committed to keeping in touch with its many grantees, partners, and other stakeholders. The Weinberg Foundation believes grants overviews like this one are a vital part of the communications process. These overviews highlight selected grants within each of the Foundation's areas of giving as well as across broader communities of funding, all reflecting the Foundation's mission of meeting basic human needs and enhancing an individual's ability to meet those needs. Within that context, emphasis is placed on older adults and the Jewish community, both nationally and in our global "hometowns" including metropolitan Baltimore, Hawaii, northeastern Pennsylvania, Israel, and the Former Soviet Union.

With total assets of more than \$2 billion and annual total grant distributions of nearly \$100 million, The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation is proud of its commitment to direct services that meet the basic needs of individuals, families, and communities. These include programs in the areas of homeless services, economic assistance, food security, and health.

Grantmaking within Basic Human Needs and Health is focused around five primary goals:

- 1) Ensure that people have a safe and stable place to call home
- 2) Serve homeless youth in receiving all appropriate support services to aid them in reaching greater self-sufficiency
- 3) Increase access to short-term economic and social service support in times of hardship
- 4) Increase access to sufficient and nutritious food in the most dignified possible way
- Increase access to health care and improve the health status of low-income individuals and families

In the following pages, the Foundation has identified selected grants of \$50,000 or more that were approved or distributed during the past three years. During that time, the Foundation approved 158 grants totaling nearly **\$23.5 million** for Basic Human Needs and Health. In addition, the Foundation paid more than **\$33.3 million** in previously approved grants for a total investment of **\$56 million**.



Here are just a few highlights:

- Creating safe and affordable housing, particularly for those who are homeless or low-income, is a focus of the Weinberg Foundation. While permanent housing is ideal, the Foundation recognizes that other options must also be available, including emergency shelter and transitional housing. In the past three years - within its portfolio of Basic Human Needs and Health the Foundation supported 14 organizations with a total of \$17.2 **million** with various types of shelter and housing projects. Of particular note, the Weinberg Foundation provided a \$1.8 million grant to the Baltimore City Mayor's Office of Human Services to support the construction of a 24-hour, year-round emergency housing and resource center for homeless men and women, including 25 convalescent care beds. The Weinberg Foundation also awarded a \$1 million grant to Habitat for Humanity of the Chesapeake to build and rehabilitate 56 homes in three different Baltimore City neighborhoods. These two projects exemplify how the Foundation is working at two ends of the continuum, from shelter to home ownership.
- The Weinberg Foundation believes that food banks are essential community resources in the fight against food insecurity. The Foundation invests in food banks which in turn support thousands of partner agencies serving hundreds of thousands of people in their regions. In the past three years, the Weinberg Foundation has approved 13 capital and operating grants, totaling \$8.9 million, to organizations that are increasing food distribution to meet greater need. One of these organizations is the Maryland Food Bank which has received Weinberg Foundation grants totaling \$550,000 over the past three fiscal years.

• The Foundation continues to support community health centers, primarily Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), with 18 operating and capital grants since FY 11. These health centers serve the uninsured and underinsured with quality primary care and wrap-around services. With the implementation of the Affordable Care Act, many of these health centers are expanding in order to serve thousands more patients. In the past three years, the Weinberg Foundation committed nearly \$8 million to FQHCs and other community health centers. In particular, the Foundation made its final payment on a \$2 million grant to Health Care for the Homeless' new site in Baltimore City where it serves more than 6,000 people a year.

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation is privileged to partner with so many extraordinary organizations, all dedicated to serving low-income and vulnerable members of our communities. The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation is one of the largest private, charitable foundations in the United States, funding nonprofits that provide direct services to low-income and vulnerable individuals and families, primarily in the U.S. and Israel.

Foundation grants are allocated through several program areas and are focused on meeting basic needs such as shelter, nutrition, health, and socialization and on enhancing an individual's ability to meet those needs. Older Adults and Workforce Development are national programs while Basic Human Needs and Health; Disabilities; Education/US; and General Community Support fund direct service providers in the Foundation's "hometown" communities of metropolitan Baltimore, northeastern Pennsylvania, Hawaii, Israel, and the Former Soviet Union. The Maryland Small Grants Program (MSGP) includes all Foundation grantmaking areas.

In the past three fiscal years, The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation approved or paid grants of \$50,000 or more totaling \$56 million. During that time, the Foundation approved 158 in new grants totaling nearly \$23.5 million for Basic Human Needs and Health. In addition, the Foundation paid more than \$33.3 million in previously approved grants.
