Hello from Baltimore!

The Weinberg Foundation is committed to keeping in touch with the community, and grants overviews like this one are a vital part of the communications process. These overviews highlight selected grants specific to Foundation program areas and communities, all reflecting the Foundation's mission of meeting basic needs and enhancing an individual's ability to meet those needs. Within that context, emphasis is placed on older adults and the Jewish community, both nationally and in our "global hometowns" including metropolitan Baltimore, Hawaii, northeastern Pennsylvania, Israel, and the Former Soviet Union.

With total assets of approximately \$2 billion, and annual total grant distributions of nearly \$100 million, The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation supports organizations and programs that respect and promote the independence, integration, individual choice, and civil rights of children and adults with intellectual, physical, and sensory disabilities as necessary preconditions for a good life. The Foundation supports innovative services designed to enable people with multiple disabilities to live a life of their own choosing in the community and typically not in institutional or congregate settings.

This overall vision of independence and integration is reflected in the Weinberg Foundation's grantmaking within the field of disabilities. We identify and fund innovative residential and therapeutic models.

Here are just a few grants highlighting the Foundation's work and direction in the field of disabilities:

- **\$3,000,000 capital grant** to build a new state-of-the-art national children's center in Jerusalem for mentally and physically challenged children. The new facility will allow SHALVA, The Association for Mentally & Physically Challenged Children in Israel, to provide increased space for programs such as hydrotherapy, respite, after-school programs, and the signature "Me and My Mommy" Down syndrome program.
- **\$1,000,000 capital grant** to provide new, integrated, deeply-affordable housing for persons with disabilities in the state of Maryland. In a joint venture, believed to be the first of its kind in the nation, the Weinberg Foundation and the State of Maryland will work together to finance affordable, permanent, integrated apartments throughout Maryland for very low-income persons with disabilities who receive either Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Supplemental Security Disability Income (SSDI). Rents are set at 15% of the area median income, as low as \$112 per month (including utilities). The first Weinberg units are expected to be available for occupancy in late 2012.
- **\$700,000 capital grant** to Achiya-Learn That You Can in B'nei-Brak, Israel to complete a new five-floor center which will serve thousands of children with learning disabilities such as dyslexia.



- **\$300,000 operating grant** to NATAL, Israel's Trauma Center for Victims of Terror and War. This grant supports emotional assistance and subsidized psychological treatment to trauma victims.
- **\$100,000 program grant** to Abilities Network, Inc. to provide additional support for the "All Children Together" project for children with autism who are attending child care or out-of-school programs in Baltimore City and County.
- **\$100,000 program grant** to SHEMESH, a program of THE ASSOCIATED: Jewish Community Federation of Baltimore, to provide special education services to children with learning disabilities in the Jewish Day Schools of Baltimore.

In both the United States and Israel, the Foundation supports evidence-based therapies such as cognitive behavior therapies and applied behavior analysis for early intervention for children on the autism spectrum. In the treatment of learning differences, the Foundation supports providers who serve children who struggle with reading and math, including dyslexia, dyscalculia, and various emotional and behavioral problems.

In the following pages, the Foundation has identified selected grants of \$50,000 or more that were approved or distributed during the past three fiscal years to organizations serving children and adults with multiple disabilities. We are pleased to report that, during that time, the Foundation distributed more than \$22 million in grants – a significant investment in the quality of life for people with disabilities, both in the United States and Israel.

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation is privileged to partner with a wide array of direct services providers, as well as governmental and philanthropic agencies, to help persons with disabilities who are in the greatest need. That collaborative effort is reflected in this summary report which the Foundation invites you to review. If you have any questions or comments, please feel free to contact the Foundation.

The Foundation supports innovative services designed to enable people with multiple disabilities to live a life of their own choosing in the community.

A life of their own choosing means achieving independence, self-respect, and self-satisfaction at school, home, and work to the greatest degree possible. The Foundation wants to encourage people without disabilities to have personal experiences with people who have disabilities to extinguish fear, stereotypes, and misconceptions. The Foundation seeks programs designed to build relationships and to prevent loneliness and isolation.

The Weinberg Foundation funds providers of direct services for people with intellectual, physical, and sensory disabilities both in the United States and Israel. Specifically, the Foundation seeks programs or projects which offer:

- **Housing which is deeply-affordable, permanent, accessible, and integrated.**
- **Jobs—customized employment in the community, a job that a person chooses and a paycheck that goes to the person—not to a provider. The Foundation does not support sheltered workshops.**
- **Early intervention for children with physical, sensory, and intellectual disabilities, especially those on the autism spectrum.**
- **Early intervention for children with learning differences such as dyslexia.**
- **Community-based services for those with psychiatric illnesses.**
- **Integrated summer camps for children with and without disabilities.**
- **Family Support – respite care, family-to-family programs, peer mentoring, and parent coaching.**
