About The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, one of the largest private charitable foundations in the United States, is dedicated to meeting the basic needs of people experiencing poverty. In 2022, the Foundation expects to provide approximately \$140 million in total grant activity supporting nonprofits that provide direct services in the areas of Housing, Health, Jobs, Education, and Community Services. Grants support organizations that serve a range of populations, including older adults, women at risk and their children, people with disabilities, and veterans, as well as the Jewish community.


The Foundation administers the majority of its funding in its priority communities of Baltimore, Chicago, Hawai'i, Israel, New York City, Northeastern Pennsylvania, and San Francisco, as well as rural communities within proximity to priority communities. Foundation funding extends to the greater metropolitan areas of the specific cities listed. All of these locations represent personal ties to the life and legacy of Harry Weinberg, as well as communities where Weinberg Foundation trustees reside and provide leadership. Since 1990, the Foundation has distributed grants totaling more than \$2.5 billion.

Commitment to the Jewish Community

In the late 1930s, Harry Weinberg pledged his then-modest assets to enable many German Jews to reach safe haven in America. As Harry's means increased over many years, so did his support of the Jewish community. This commitment remains at the core of the Weinberg Foundation's identity.

The Foundation supports organizations that serve people experiencing poverty within the Jewish community, both in the United States and Israel. Grants to support the Jewish community align with the Foundation's funding priorities within the areas of Housing, Health, Jobs, Education, and Community Services. In Israel, the Foundation has a long history of supporting direct service-providers, including the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee's (JDC) work dedicated to serving vulnerable older adults (Eshel) and providing job training for low-income populations (TEVET). In 2018, the Foundation expanded its commitment in Israel to organizations serving women at risk and their children.

In North America, over nearly three decades, the Foundation has provided approximately \$30 million to organizations serving Holocaust survivors, and in Baltimore the Foundation is the largest contributor to The Associated: Jewish Federation of Baltimore (The Associated), providing one of the single largest annual campaign gifts to any Jewish Federation. The Foundation is also engaged in a range of proactive strategic initiatives focused on addressing Jewish poverty on a national scale, especially through its leading role in founding the National Affinity Group on Jewish Poverty. In addition, the Foundation supports various initiatives, which strengthen the Jewish nonprofit sector at-large, including those working to develop the next generation of leaders and promote diversity, equity, and inclusion within the Jewish community.

Signature US Jewish Initiatives

CLAIMS CONFERENCE

Over the past decade, the Foundation has provided almost \$20 million to Claims Conference to support emergency assistance, including medical and dental care, food assistance, and housing, for Holocaust Survivors living in the United States.

COMBATING ANTISEMITISM

In response to rising levels of antisemitism in the United States, the Foundation has provided over \$3 million in grants since 2019 to the Anti-Defamation League, Jewish Federations, and Jewish Community Relations Councils (JCRCs) in its priority communities, and other national organizations focused on addressing antisemitism in all of its forms and ensuring the safety and security of the Jewish community.

EMPOWERING JEWS OF COLOR

Jews of Color Initiative

The Jews of Color Initiative (JOCI) is a national effort focused on building and advancing the professional, organizational, and communal field for Jews of Color through grantmaking, research, and community education. The Foundation has committed more than \$2 million to JOCI and related efforts.

HAWAI'I JEWISH COMMUNITY INITIATIVE

In December 2019, the Foundation began regularly convening leaders in the business, government, nonprofit, and philanthropic sectors to identify key priorities across the diverse and pluralistic Hawai'i Jewish community, as well as opportunities to make a meaningful difference in Hawai'i. Since then, the Foundation's commitment to deepen support of Hawai'i's Jewish community has also included Nitzavim Hawai'i, a two-year Jewish cohort to convene diverse Jewish nonprofit leaders from around the islands, and the first ever comprehensive needs assessment conducted within the Hawai'i Jewish community.

Signature US Jewish Initiatives (continued)

LEADING EDGE

▲ LEADING EDGE Leading Edge helps Jewish organizations attract, develop, and retain top talent. This organization offers a cohort-based program for onboarding new CEOs, strengthens partnerships between lay leaders and professionals, and conducts original research, including its annual employee engagement survey. The Foundation has contributed more than \$3 million in support of this organization.

THE NATAN FUND

In 2021, the Foundation provided a grant of \$575,000 to The Natan Fund to support a grants program focused on start-ups and pilot projects related to Jewish poverty. At least half of the members of the committee responsible for making grant recommendations will have lived experience with poverty.

NATIONAL AFFINITY GROUP ON JEWISH POVERTY



In partnership with the Jewish Funders Network, the Foundation is supporting a nationwide collaborative effort dedicated to addressing the issue of poverty within the Jewish community throughout the United States. This affinity group was founded at the inaugural National Convening on Jewish Poverty in San Francisco on March 19, 2019, where more than 200 experts on Jewish

poverty, including researchers, direct-service providers, federation leaders, and philanthropists attended and pledged to bring more focus to this issue. Specific goals identified to date include assembling reliable and uniform data on Jewish poverty in America; changing the narrative around Jewish poverty; and developing, aggregating, and sharing best practices and models of poverty alleviation.

NONPROFIT TECHNOLOGY ENTERPRISE NETWORK

In partnership with Nonprofit Technology Enterprise Network (NTEN), the Foundation committed \$5.7 million in January of 2022 to upgrade the information technology systems for an estimated 100 Jewish nonprofits, as well as provide training and coaching for these organizations. Technology grants to nonprofits, which will include members of the Network of Jewish Human Service Agencies (NJHSA) and Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA), as well as other Foundation grantees, will enhance direct services and organizational infrastructure within the Jewish nonprofit sector.

RESEARCH BENCHMARKING INITIATIVE

In partnership with Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA), the Foundation has provided over \$1 million to support a research initiative focused on poverty, race and ethnicity, and the LGBTQ community. Established in 2019, this initiative will provide grants to 15 Jewish communities in the United States to use a common set of research questions in these areas, with the goal of achieving better and more aligned data.

SAFETYRESPECTEQUITY



The SafetyRespectEquity (SRE) Network works to ensure safe, respectful, and equitable Jewish workplaces and communal spaces. Through convenings, research, and development of national standards, this organization seeks to advance women's leadership and gender equity, as well as address sexual harassment, sexism, and gender discrimination. The Foundation has committed more than \$1 million to support the SRE Network.

YASHAR - SUPPORT FOR INCLUSION AT JEWISH CAMP



In partnership with the Foundation for Jewish Camp, the Weinberg Foundation has committed \$12 million to this grants initiative. The Yashar Initiative aims to enhance accessibility and inclusion for campers and staff with disabilities by providing capital improvements, professional development,

staff training, research, and evaluation to both participating camps and the field at-large.

Grantmaking in Israel

Today, the Foundation invests approximately \$18 million annually to nonprofits in Israel that provide direct services in the following three areas—Aging in Community, Jobs, and Women at Risk and Their Children. These areas are aligned with the Foundation's funding priorities under the Housing, Health, and Jobs focus areas.

Signature Israel Initiatives

DAY CARE CENTERS FOR OLDER ADULTS

In partnership with the National Insurance Institute (NII), the Foundation provided 11 grants totaling \$5,450,000, as part of two separate capital initiatives focused on older adult day care centers. Specifically, the centers serve older adults coping with cognitive decline, as well as those dealing with Alzheimer's and related dementia.

THE "ESHKOLOT" CULTURE CHANGE INITIATIVE

In partnership with the National Insurance Institute (NII), the Foundation has provided five grants totaling \$3,900,000 to leverage funding from several partner organizations including the Claims Conference with the goal of promoting client-centered care for older adults living in skilled nursing residences.

SHEATUFIM—STRATEGIES FOR SOCIAL IMPACT (INITIATIVE TO REDUCE INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE)

The Foundation provided a \$600,000 grant to support Sheatufim, which serves as the "backbone organization" of the Initiative to Reduce Intimate Partner Violence, launched in January 2021. The initiative follows the collective impact model, which deals systemically with complex social problems by creating coordinated, cross-sector strategies and services.

THE OGEN GROUP

Advancing its CDFI (Community Development Financial Institution) initiative, the Foundation provided a \$3 million grant to Ogen, a nonprofit social-finance fund in Israel, to support its growth as one of the first financial intermediaries in Israel helping nonprofits achieve their missions through equitable access to capital. Ogen is committed to improving financial inclusion and opportunity in Israel by providing affordable loans and financial mentoring for nonprofits, small businesses, and individuals who are not served by mainstream financial institutions or government programs.
