THE FOUNDATION OWNED SEVERAL BUILDINGS THAT WERE DESTROYED OR SEVERELY DAMAGED BY THE WILDFIRES ON AUGUST 8, 2023 IN LAHAINA, MAUI. ON AUGUST 10, 2023, PRESIDENT BIDEN DECLARED A MAJOR DISASTER FOR THE STATE OF HAWAII. THE FOUNDATION RECEIVED PAYMENTS OF \$39,000,956 FROM INSURANCE CARRIERS RELATING TO THIS INVOLUNTARY DESTRUCTION. PURSUANT TO IRS REGULATIONS, THE PAYMENTS RECEIVED IN EXCESS OF THE TAX BASIS IS RECOGNIZED AS A DEFERRED GAIN ON INSURANCE PROCEEDS UNTIL SUCH TIME THE BUILDINGS ARE REBUILT, OR A REPLACEMENT PROPERTY IS PURCHASED. BASIS OF THE AFFECTED ASSETS WAS \$2,152,873 AND THE DEFERRED GAIN IS \$36,848,083. IT IS THE INTENT OF THE FOUNDATION TO USE THE INSURANCE PROCEEDS TO REBUILD THE PROPERTIES IN LAHAINA AT SUCH TIME AS THE COUNTY OF MAUI ALLOWS. IT IS ANTICIPATED THE REBUILD PERIOD WILL TAKE IF THE PERIOD TO REBUILD IS LONGER THAN SEVERAL YEARS TO COMPLETE. ALLOWABLE YEARS PROVIDED IN IRS REGULATIONS, THE FOUNDATION INTENDS TO REQUEST AN EXTENSION TO FURTHER DEFER THE GAIN UNTIL SUCH TIME THAT THE REBUILD CAN BE COMPLETED. AN EXTENSION OF TIME IS ALLOWABLE BY THE IRS WHEN THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN A FEDERALLY DECLARED DISASTER AREA.
